Applicable User Manual: v4.9

Modifications:

- It is now possible to export any real or integer user entities and Thermisol variables in h5 file. This can be done by adding the name of the user entity in the H5_RES0 or H5_RES1 Thermisol control variable. Adding 'VAR' in H5_RES0 or H5_RES1 variable allows to store all the real and integer user variables (defined in the \$VARIABLES block) at the initialization (for H5_RES0) or during the whole simulation at the time frequency given by H5_FREQ (for H5_RES1). See the Thermisol User Manual for more details and example.
- Fixed an incorrect output in the temp.out file. The NRLXCC (node at which the maximum temperature change has been obtained) was wrong when it was an EDGE node.

- It is now possible to perform a complete Thermisol calculation (without error) from file (dck or sysprc) containing a space character in its name. However, it is always advisable to avoid spaces.
- Fixed a bug that generated NaN values when using RCN method with parametric couplings and materials with zero conductivity.
- Increased number of maximum user entities defined in the DCK file from 10 to 100.
- Fixed a bug that split an if loop into two subroutines when generating fortran code with Thermisol.
- Fixed a bug that made it impossible to modify labels using macros.

Corrections:

- The node surface values are now written with %.6E format in the nod.nwk file to avoid that the TSINK routine of Thermisol generates NAN values because of a lack of precision.
- Creation of a new entry icon "GF" for the Skeleton module box (in the processing tab of the GUI). This entry icon allows connecting directly the Convection module to the Skeleton module. **Because of this new entry icon, Systema does not ensure down compatibility on processing files (capacity to open files from previous versions). It is mandatory to rebuild the old processing files.**

Language:

- **New \$GLOBAL block:**

Context: Thermica exports parametric data to Thermisol so to ease the parametric analysis at TMM level (for instance material properties such as the conductivity). When using sub-models, material properties or any parametric data shall be locally declared into each model (as locals, variables or arrays...) so these declarations are duplicated several times and modifying a parameter may become complex.

Why this new block: The new \$GLOBAL block, which shall be written outside of any model, allows to declare \$LOCALS, \$VARIABLES and \$ARRAYS visible from any model level. It then solves the difficulties of managing material parametric properties when using sub-models.

- **New \$GLOBAL-CASE N block:**

For managing TMM cases, the newly created \$GLOBAL block may be duplicated and assigned to a case number. A variable can then have a different value assigned depending on the executed case.

In batch command, the call of a specific case may be done using the argument `-case N`. The pre-processor will then skip the reading of \$GLOBAL-CASE blocks not corresponding to the one specified in the execution command.

Standard output files will automatically include the case number in their names so all cases may be ran into the same directory.

(This feature has be implemented especially for the needs of the Outgassing solver, now also embedded into Thermisol, where hundreds of different material properties shall be used for a single model)

- New FATHER syntax allowing to access a data defined into a father model (ex: *FATHER:MyVar*)

Pre-processor:

- Correction: suppression of unnecessary GENMOR code generated when a local constant of a submodel was used
- Extension of \$ELEMENT submodel usage:
 - Declaration of submodels into an \$ELEMENT submodel
 - Use of a substitution parameter to declare a node label
 - A substitution variable may be a symbol to be resolved latter in its usage context
- Correction: Use of a function (*subroutines not concerned*) of a pre-compiled user library from a definition block (\$NODES or \$CONDUCTORS) was leading to an error message

Solver Library:

- New cyclic convergence routine SCYCLE which can handle up to 32 different convergence criteria on nodal groups. This routine manages automatically the outputs (no \$OUTPUTS call during the convergence cycles and convergence results stored into a different h5 file, plus the execution of a final cycle with the re-activation of standard outputs). A reporting is also written into the convergence control file (csv) and into the ascii output file (out).
- New GRPAVE2 function to computes quadratic average
- New GRPAVE_W and GRPAVE2_W functions to compute arithmetic and quadratic average weighted by a nodal entity (typically the node areas or capacitances)
- New thermostat function (THSTAT) suitable for both steady-state and transient computations

4.4.1**Pre-processor:**

4.3.2

Generality:

- **Environment variables becomes optional**

Default values are set in order to suppress the declaration of the variables.

Even on Windows, if MinGW is installed with SYSTEMA, the path to the gcc compiler is not necessary.

➤ **Error redirection on the log file**

All errors including Fortran compilation error are now reported in the log file. This is especially necessary for Windows users for which the background execution is not seen.

Pre-processor:

➤ **Automatic reposition to the 6th column of Fortran code**

To prevent Fortran error when user's code is not correctly placed.

The "continue" character is the "&" one and is automatically set on the 5th column.

Only numbers remain on the 5 first columns for tag declaration.

➤ **Check of syntax Nxxxxx**

The syntax Nxxxx designs the nodal entity xxxx. However in THERMICA v3, this symbol is used to declare solar fluxes arrays. A check is performed in order to remain compatible with v3 build models.

➤ **Management of new nodal entities FX, FY, FZ**

Those new nodal entities are used to store the geometrical localization of the nodes.

➤ **Correction of function references in Fortran translated code**

Calls to functions inside Mortran subroutine could be misunderstood. This has been corrected

➤ **Possibility to use implicit references to nodes and couplings in executive blocks**

It is now possible to use implicit references to set nodal properties or couplings, the nodal references being given with a symbol or an expression corresponding to the user nodal number. It also allows the use of loops combined with nodal or coupling references in the executive blocks.

➤ **Possibility to use \$LOCALS constants in the \$ARRAYS and \$TABLES blocks**

Solver Library:

➤ **Correction of convergence problems**

This release of THERMISOL has been intensively validated and consolidated on many industrial cases. Convergence problems on steady-state and transient analysis have been solved.

➤ **Change of usual THERMISOL TSINK function**

The usual TSINK function has been renamed TSINKN in order not to conflict with the ESATAN-like TSINK one.

➤ **New ESTAN-like TSINK & NODFNC function**

The functions have been implemented as described in the ESATAN user's manual.

➤ **Crank-Nicholson scheme**

New 2nd order prediction: Allows a closer guess of the solution before iterating on the implicit resolution.

➤ **New INBALT / ENBALT control variables**

The total balance is the sum of all diffusive nodes balances. In steady-state cases, it is almost equivalent to the INBALA/ENBALA variables except that it takes into account internal unbalances. The advantage of this definition is that it is also suitable for transient analysis which did not have a physical convergence criterion.

➤ **CSV output file**

Gives more information on the current run like time error estimation on transient analysis...

*A new control variable has been created to control the frequency of dump **CSV_FREQ***

➤ **H5 output file**

*The functions associated with the H5 files are **H5_INIT** (filename) , **H5_DUMP** , **H5_CLOSE***

Only a single frequency of storage has been kept in order to simplify the post-processing analysis tools (and to be sure of their robustness)

Skeleton:

➤ **Advanced management of output control**

For cyclic convergence cases, it is possible to set the storage for the last orbit

➤ **Possibility to re-use a previous skeleton in addition to new files to input**

➤ **Correction of expansion problems**

➤ **“No-contextual” expansion has been added**

If no blocks are specified in the file to expand through a #READ instruction, all the content of the file is copied.

POSTHER:

➤ **Flux budget: correction of edge specification**

The definition of that group of nodes was bugged.

➤ **Radiative budget: problem of the nodal group area computation**

B-PLOT:

➤ **Correction of a bug when the initial date (in julian days) was not zero**

In cases made by SYSTEMA v4, the reference date is set. Those models could not be displayed by B-PLOT in previous THERMISOL versions.

➤ **Graphical definition of B-PLOT input**

In addition of creating a B-PLOT file by hand, it is also possible to define the graph in the GUI edition box of B-PLOT.

4.3.1

Pre-processor:

➤ **New syntax in declarations: 'U'**

Understood as a zero but allows reading of Esatan files

➤ **Priority of the symbol ':' versus '+'**

T:1000 + 25 means the temperature of node 1000 + 25°C

T:(1000+25) means the temperature of node 1025

➤ **Undeclared variables checking**

Warnings are output to the log file and to the xterm window to notice all undeclared variables.

It is however possible that some symbols are recognized as undeclared variables (the list is just given so the user so it is possible to check if there are errors or not in his input model)

➤ **ZNODES: extension of definition**

The ZNODES specification is a character string describing the nodes to be considered by some functions (mainly output routines).

The definition of the ZNODES specification has been extended with the following functionalities:

- *A ZNODES specification can be the combination of singular ZNODES specifications separated by ";"*
- *Any singular ZNODES spec can be additive or subtractive (using the prefix '!')*
- *The singular ZNODES definitions are*
 - *ALL, ONLY*
 - *[model path], [model path]:ONLY*
 - *#[node list separated by ',']*
 - *@[label or partial label]*
 - *[model path]@[label or partial label], ONLY@[label or partial label], [model path]:ONLY@[label or partial label]*

Solver Library:

➤ **New functions: FLUXGL / FLUXGR / FLUXGF / FLUXGT**

Functions similar to FLUXL / FLUXR / FLUXF and FLUXT but with ZNODES inputs to defined the node groups

➤ **New function: PRQBOU**

This subroutine prints the heat flows along all conductors in submodel MODEL which cross the submodel boundary

➤ **New function: PRTTMD**

This subroutine prints the maximum temperature difference between the nodes described in NODES in the model described by MODEL, and prints the 2 nodes for which the maximum difference is observed

➤ **New function: PRQNOD**

This subroutine prints the heat flows along all conductors of the group of nodes described by NODES in submodel MODEL which cross the boundary of the group of nodes

➤ **New function: DMPHTN**

This subroutine produces a set of CSV files containing nodal data in vector form (temperature, capacitance, and total heat load, one row per node) and conductance matrices (separately linear, radiative and fluidic). The latter are complete NxN matrices (N being the number of nodes in the model), with a zero entry wherever there is no conductor defined between the row and column nodes. This format is designed to be amenable to loading into numeric computation tools such as MATLAB®. There is also a list of nodes in the same row/column order, giving node type, number, label and model name

➤ **Bug in the TSINK function**

A bug was introduced in this function in version 4.3.0. This bug is fixed

➤ **SLFWBK_OLD**

This obsolete routine SLFWBK has been kept using the name SLFWBK_OLD. If SLFWBK is called it is automatically redirected to SCRANK (with a warning for the user)

➤ **Explicit storage into the H5 file through a “CALL POSTHER()”**

This lets the user have a full control of the storage in the h5 file. A POSTHER_INIT and a POSTHER_CLOSE functions are also available to create and close h5 files

➤ **Negative times: automatically not stored in the h5 file**

This is an easy way to store only the last orbit of a cyclic convergence run

➤ **Problem of OUTINT management**

The update of the OUTINT control variables was not taken into account except when the OUTPUTS block was called

➤ **Error in the damping factor management**

A case has raised a problem of damping factor management. This is corrected in this version

Skeleton:

➤ **Files with a blank in reading instructions:**

A correction has been made to allow this kind of files

➤ **Updated to manage the new POSTHER storage routines**

Posther:

➤ **1st official release of POSTHER as a THERMISOL component**

Implementation based on ASG24 needs

B-Plot:

➤ **1st official release of B-PLOT as a THERMISOL component**

This new version is compatible with the new h5 file standards. The inclusion of B-Plot into THERMISOL should provide a better maintenance of this software.

NTP (or NTPHJ) files are however not supported by this version.

4.3.0

Pre-processor:

➤ **New executive blocks : \$VTEMPERATURE / \$VTIME / \$VRESULT**

Those blocks allow a better management of dependencies

➤ **Management of \$EVENTS**

Events are now available. See the documentation for more details

➤ **Spell of "\$TABLES"**

The 2 syntax are allowed: \$TABLE or \$TABLES

➤ **Declarations in \$VARIABLES (or \$CONSTANTS) with formulae added to GENMOR code**

This will automatically update variables depending on formulae

➤ **More implicit declarations**

The Mortran syntax possibilities have been extended with the possibility of using formulae into an implicit node reference. Some data can also be directly accessed instead of the indirect access through functions (NS: status of a node, N: internal number of a node, GLS/GRS/GFS: status of a coupling). Those data can be accessed in read/write modes.

➤ **Syntax with sub-models**

Mortran syntax using sub-models where unstable. This is corrected.

➤ **Automatic conversion from Single to Double**

REAL declarations are converted to DOUBLE PRECISION ones.

Floats like 5.3 are converted with a "D0" at the end.

Exponents “e” or “E” are converted to “D” exponents

➤ **Correction on the \$PARAMETERS block**

The use of this block is fully validated and operational

➤ **Double declarations of Arrays return errors**

Pre-process checker extension

Solver Library:

➤ **New GET / SET functions**

To access some Mortran values. This was necessary for the building of a “black box” module

➤ **Optimisation of SOLVIT**

The \$VTEMPERATURE block calls are manage to prevent from divergences due to instabilities between the user’s code and the resolution

➤ **Interpolation routines: 2nd order now available**

The user can now choose between first and second order interpolations.

Skeleton:

➤ **#READ converted to ##READ after expansion**

To avoid further re-expansions.

➤ **Expansion of blocks \$INCLUDES bugged**

This is corrected

Old syntax was not convenient

Generality:

➤ **Compatibility with the v4 environment**

This is the first release compatible with the v4 environment. It includes a package for the SYSTEMA v4 interface.

➤ **Stabilisation of the H5 interface**

The H5 result file lays on a standard interface used for the SYSTEMA / Applications communications.

Pre-processor:

➤ **Declared constants in the block \$LOCALS available in all model**

Instead of the definition blocks only

➤ **\$LOCALS : guaranty of Double Precision full compatibility**

Less digit were preserved before.

➤ **Automatic Split of the Subroutines**

Mortran subroutines can be automatically split to sped-up the compiler performances. The GENMOR subroutine is automatically split. User subroutines can do use this option through the argument "SPLIT=xxxxx"
